"YOUR CHOICE" BOOK REVIEW

Term 4, 2020 Due: Week 8, Monday 23rd November

Part 1

This term, you will be required to use the following tasks to create a book review. It can be presented in any way you like (poster, booklet, power point, etc.). Juniors choose at least 4-5 items, Middles choose at least 6-7 items and Seniors choose at least 8-9 items.

- 1. Explain the basic plot.
- 2. Choose a quote from a character. Write why it would or wouldn't be a good motto by which to live your life.
- 3. Write about something you learnt about the environment or setting in which the book takes place.
- 4. Explain 5 things you learned while reading the book
- 5. Make several sketches of some of the scenes in the book and label them.
- 6. Write about the most interesting part of the book.
- 7. Write about a character you liked or disliked
- 8. Make a poem about the story.
- 9. Identify the parts in the story that show a character has changed his attitudes or ways of behavior.
- 10. Write a paragraph telling about the title. Is it appropriate? Why? Why not?
- 11. Stories are made with conflicts and solutions. Describe the problem or conflict existing for the main character in the book. Tell how the conflict was or was not resolved. Could it have been handled differently?
- 12. Write about the time period of your book. Was your book set in a different time?
- 13. Select one character from the book you read who has the qualities of a heroine or hero. List these qualities and tell why you think they are heroic.
- 14. List five of the main characters from the book you read. Give three examples of what each character learned or did not learn in the book.
- 15. Design a symbol for your novel.
- 16. Design an advertising flyer to advertise your novel.
- 17. Write information about the author.
- 18. Write 10 questions to ask your character. Then, answer each question as you think the character would respond.
- 19. Make a map of places where the story took place. The map should be coloured and write a description of what each place is and why it is important.
- 20. Make a book mark that represents your book.

Part 2
